After a discussion of the future of the Association and events and projects, a buffet dinner was enjoyed by all attendees with refreshments and beverages.

- The attendees were informed about the efforts to place a memorial stone to the 8th Armored Division at **Arlington National Cemetery**. The marker has been designed, some funds are available, but permission is still being negotiated. It is hoped that we will be able to dedicate the stone memorial next year 2015!
- An 8th Armored Division **Memorial** to be placed at an appropriate locale was also discussed. Areas under consideration are: The new Army Museum at Ft Belvoir, VA; or at Freedoms Foundation. More details will follow and funds will have to be raised.
- Attendees enjoyed a large display of artifacts, photos, books, documents, and souvenirs of the 8th Armored Division veterans.

On Saturday, a contingent of Association members and 8th Armored Division veterans departed Bensalem for a **tour of the Valley Forge** area. The itinerary included:

• **Battle of the Bugle Memorial** on the campus of Valley Forge Military Academy for photo opportunities in a light rain

- Freedoms Foundation campus with the Medal of Honor Grove, where an acre section for each state features the names and records of that state's MOF recipients. There are also a number of Army Division memorials for the 2nd & 3rd Armored Division, and the 29th & 75th Infantry Divisions. The site also has a number of inspiring monuments to Washington and other Founders, and a new memorial to the 'Gold Star' Families that was being installed as we arrived. We were the first to visit the new memorial! We also met a Board member who spoke to the group about Freedoms Foundation and the new memorial.
- A fine lunch followed at a nearby 'home-style' restaurant G-Lounge of Valley Forge.
- After lunch we continued our tour by visiting Valley Forge National Park, site of the winter encampment of the Continental Army in 1777 1778, a very trying time for the battered and bruised Army of Washington. We visited the Visitor's Center, Museum and Gift Shop, as well as viewed the Park's informational film on the site.
- A driving tour followed and a stop at the Washington Chapel saw a military wedding (Navy) in progress.
- We left the area to return to Bensalem in our van and visited the **PRAX Casino** close to the hotel. David Clare was able to win enough money to pay for his tolls for the trip home to Long Island, N.Y.
- All agreed that they enjoyed the Reunion Tour immensely, and it was also agreed by the Association officers that there would be a 2015 8th Armored Division Association Reunion next year. Time and place to be determined!

- Souvenirs! We still have a number of 8th Armored Division souvenir items: a **decal** and **Association baseball cap**. The caps are gratis to original veterans, \$10 to members, \$15 to non-members sent via post. - New member: Ralph Peeters of the Netherlands has adopted the graves of 8th Armored Division men who lie at rest in Margraten American Soldiers' Cemetery in the Netherlands. He has volunteered to be our correspondent in Europe and keep us informed of the events and actions on behalf of our honored dead, interred in Europe. His articles will appear in future 'Thundering Herd' newsletters. Thank you Ralph Peeters!
- 8th Armored Division Association Memorial at Arlington National Cemetery I am presently close to completing the work on obtaining a permanent memorial marker to place and dedicate to the veterans of the Division who paid the ultimate sacrifice during WWII, and all the veterans living and deceased. I have filed a formal request and have been in contact with the Cemetery officials. We are in the final stages of approval and have raised the funds necessary to manufacture, place and dedicate the stone marker. We hope to be able to dedicate the marker in **September of 2015** at next year's Reunion.
- We will also in the process of re-establishing our **non-profit status** with the IRS for the Association in order to grant tax deductions for such donations. This process is being taken care of by a good friend of mine who is a lawyer and a member of my Legion Post.
- 8th Armored Division Association Memorial Approved for placement at the U.S. Army Museum, Ft Belvoir, VA.

At the 2013 Reunion, the idea of placing a memorial plaque to honor all veterans of the 8th Armored Division was discussed and approved. This project will take a bit of time. I am including three (3) sample designs for the commemorative bronze plaque for your review. *Please let me know which plaque you like best*! As soon as I have the winning design, and the estimated costs, I will begin to request support in the form of donations. All honors to the men of the 8th Armored Division both living and deceased!





FREE FOR WWII VETERANS BULGE REENACTMENT 70th Anniversary Commemoration Battle

TO HONOR VETERANS of WORLD WAR II

Battle of the Bulge Commemoration Living History Week Fort Indiantown Gap, Annville, Pennsylvania January 27th - February 1st, 2015

The World War II Federation invites all vets to the Battle of the Bulge Reenactment this coming January and will again be honoring the WW II Veterans during the week, with a special Reception scheduled for Friday, 30 Jan 2015, free for WWII Vets.

On Tues 27 Jan 2015, Veterans may arrive after 1400 hours on. As usual, the Veterans will have a hospitality suite set up in their barracks as well as memorabilia & video displays. We most likely will be in **Area 13**.

- Attendees should bring a pillow, sheets and a blanket (or a sleeping bag) for their bunk as well as wash cloth and towel and shower clogs. All sleeping is on lower bunks.
- Enjoy a week of camaraderie, relaxation, WWII videos, stories and hospitality and a chance to relive your basic training days in original WWII Barracks.
- Enjoy the transformation of the barracks area by the reenactors to WWII period and enjoy the many restored WWII vehicles.
- Meet reenactors who are interested in learning from WWII veterans about the period as well as the respect that they hold for you.

On Friday, 30 Jan 2015, the Federation will salute the Veterans.

- At 1600 hours there will be a **Wreath Laying** at the VBOB Monument and 21 gun salute, and a Tactical Battle Briefing at 1630 Hours in the Community Club.
- There will be a **free reception** there for WWII Veterans at 1700 hours (others may attend at \$15.00).
- As usual there will be **1940 Movies** in Veterans Bldg #12-15 and hospitality in the Veterans' Barracks. The cost of the event is \$70.00 which includes 5 nights bunk in the barracks and Dinner and Period Entertainment USO-type show on the Saturday night.

On **Saturday, 31 January** at 1030 hours, **Veteran Tour of the Battlefield**, at 1300 Public Battle scenario Area 12, 1700 Buses leave for Community Club, 1800 Dinner, 2000 period entertainment & talent show followed by dancing. WWII Veterans will be free again this year. Non Veterans accompanied by a WWII veteran and others will pay \$75 for the 5 nights in the barracks which will also include the Saturday nite dinner (Option A). Those not wanting the Sat Nite Dinner the fee is \$50 (Option B). Those not staying in the Barracks but want the Sat nite dinner the fee is \$30. For details go to http://www.wwiifederation.org/c5

Interesting reminiscences follow from **veteran Bob Schulte**, and a new veteran member of the Association. I asked him to send me some old stories of his service. What he wrote appears below. It may be a bit controversial, but sincere and still a vivid memory after so many years.

I hope you enjoy his stories. (forgive the text which I had to scan)

Dear Andy,

Please forgive me for being so tardy in responding to you. Many medical problems have come my way interrupting my, ah hem, 'social life' I have been. very busy in such matters as there is a d aily social calendar here at my retirement residence plus my own family life which includes many friends. It is a job remembering to call certain people, to send out birthday cards and friendly notes and so forth. Also, there is a myriad of activities too here (at home--which I call it) and the affairs of social nature with my many friends.

Unfortunately, these friends formerly were husbands and wives but now dwindling down to a number of widows. I am still very happy to be fortunate enough that I am invited to their family and extended family affairs.

This month I have been invited to five graduation parties of which I am definitely attending and, of course, putting a dent in my bank-roll. These younger people

have really been so nice to me as we grew older and now their grandchildren are taking over; always glad to see you and provide assistance.

Well now, sincere thanks to you for sending me such great items.

I wondered - 'what can this be''' - when I saw the package and then upon opening the parcel discovered the "goodies" you had sent to me.

Each one was admired and I especially am fond of the Association cap. I plan to wear it when we sit out on our patio here which is huge and 'show-off' a bit. Once in a while the men (who are outnumbered here by far) will speak about their military service. I don't get into particulars because I had one heck of a time in my outfit.

Andy, we had some of the most cowardly and egocentric officers you could ever find. I was in the 405th Armored Field Artillery HQ Battery and when overseas I was the Battery Commander's chauffeur, Captain XXXX (you know, I disliked him so much and can't remember his first name) who was despicable. For one thing, he would make me change places in the jeep when we approached any type of edifice as he knew snipers always aimed for the passenger. I said to him, "Captain, why don't you just give me your helmet with the captain's insignia"?

He and First Lt. XXX always bunked together and they were the most unclean persons imaginable, while demanding that the personnel were always bathed and shaved, etc. The Lt•• once took off his shoes and socks and his ankles were BLACK.

The Capt. had the entire back of our jeep filled with things that he had confiscateda huge blow-up bed-roll, a radio, clothing, a Musette bag filled with rolls of film that he had taken (which later disappeared and he wanted to court martial me because he accused me of stealing it!)

He just simply confiscated my "C-Rations', which was better food, and gave me his "K-Rations", which were less likeable. When I complained once, he said "What can you do about it?" "Prove it".

He almost killed me once - we were moving out, assembling, and there was 'gun silence'. The Captain got into the jeep and set his carbine down too hard; the butt Page 14 of 18

hit the floor of the jeep sharply and the gun fired. Colonel Logan came and was infuriated asking, "Who the (@c%*+=#@ shot that gun?".

The captain without batting an eye thumbed and tilted his head toward me. The Colonel slowly shook his head from side to side, his mouth went up on one side and he winked at me--getting the picture. The bullet from the Captain's gun just tipped my helmet and pushed it askew on my head. If that bullet had been a fraction of an inch off I could have been killed or severely wounded. What an A--hole!!!!! I had my both hands on the steering wheel and the Captain was still holding the gun--now---come on---

Someone had a huge wooden box assembled, larger than a coffin. William Kelly, the bugler (he had no bugle) was assigned this box and made 'man-servant' to the officers. This box was filled with fine table linens, place settings, cloth napkins, cutlery and other table items. No matter where we were quartered, Kelly (he cried over this) had to seek out a house or building wherein the officers would be quartered and set the table, get food ready or procure from the mess truck and wait on these guys. Can you imagine this? In Germany, in combat!

The Captain would look through the town or, whatever, select a 'suitable' building wherein the officers would be quartered, notify Kelly and then the other men would be told they could disperse.

These were just a few of the things that the Captain perpetrated on us. You know, I often wondered why some of these officers were not shot by one of the men in the Battery. They were just horrid!

The Captain had the entire back of the jeep, as I told you, with 'his belongings' and I tied my bed-roll on the bumper. One day in a bombed out village, I was looking through the debris of a home and found a kaleidoscope and was perusing it and the viewing cards. The Captain saw me and accused me of looting and was going to see that I was court martialed. He actually accused me of 'stealing'. I looked up at him and said, "What about your things in the back of the jeep? He lowered his head and walked away.

Gosh, Andy. This is turning into a composition. I could go on and on, telling some weird tales about our former Battery Commander, Captain XXX – talk about a 'nut Page 15 of 18

case'. Yikes! Well, again I am delighted with everything you have sent me. You were very generous and kind and a charitable person, and I am happy to correspond with you."
